INTERNATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES

Higher education in developed countries such as Finland, Italy, the United States, Japan, and Korea is feasible through student exchange programs. The opportunity to pursue undergraduate and graduate studies at the University of Trento ranked 457th among 1,400 universities worldwide.

NIU has established close cooperation with several universities in the United States. As a result of this, the first exchange programs will start in January 2024.

Several European countries - Sweden, Estonia, Latvia, Lithuania, Italy, and others - are open to cooperation with their higher education institutions, business entities, research and innovation centers, and other large companies.



Joint programs with Karelia UAS in Finland:

An international diploma (double degree) and joint programs with Karelian UAS in Finland that educate international specialists in "International Business," "Industrial Management," and "Computer Engineering."



International training courses:

With the participation of over a hundred Kazakh pedagogues and school principals, five seasons were organized continuously offline and online for representatives of the republic's education sector.

“EVENING OF FINNISH EDUCATION



The “Evening of Finnish Education” took place on February 21, 2023, at NIU and was attended by 50 distinguished guests. Among the attendees were notable individuals such as Willi Skinarri, the Minister for Development Cooperation and Foreign Trade of Finland; Ilkka Raisenyan, the Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of Finland to Uzbekistan; Petri Raivo, the President of Karelia UAS, leaders of prominent Finnish companies, representatives from various ministries, agencies, international organizations, and the diplomatic corps of the Republic of Uzbekistan.

The purpose is to enhance collaboration between Uzbekistan and Finland in education and business, facilitating the implementation of cooperative scientific and academic endeavors, engaging in international grant programs, and fostering the advancement of scientific research.



Results:

- * The Finnish Minister for Development Cooperation and Foreign Trade of Finland, Willi Skinarri, and the Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary Ambassador of Finland to Uzbekistan, Ilkka Raisenyan, were awarded the title of “Honorary Doctor”;
- * An agreement was signed between NIU and Karelia UAS;
- * A memorandum of understanding was signed with UNICEF’s representative office in Uzbekistan.



THE INTERNATIONAL SEMINAR TRAINING

On June 5-8, 2023, a collaborative effort between NIU and the UAS of Karelia resulted in the organization of an international seminar training. This seminar aimed to provide professional development opportunities for instructors and researchers employed within Uzbekistan's higher education system. The seminar focused on two key topics: "Bologna processes and the principles of quality management in higher education" and "The European research space and its global responsibility."

Results:

- * The Finnish experts presented an overview of Finnish higher education and universities of applied sciences, focusing on labor-based and practical pedagogy at NIU;
- * The Bologna process, European education, quality management concepts in higher education, and contemporary experiences with competency-based curricula were studied.

THE INTERNATIONAL SCIENTIFIC AND PRACTICAL CONFERENCE

The international scientific and practical conference was held on March 28-30, 2023, under the theme "Ensuring the rule of law: Finland's experience," organized by the Rule of Law Center of the University of Helsinki, Tashkent State Law University and NIU.

Results:

- * The experience of Finland, the leading country in the world in terms of the rule of law, was widely studied;
- * an initiative to strengthen the rule of law and democratic processes was put forward through the council and within the framework of joint educational programs and the functional capabilities of legislative institutions.

“INTERNATIONAL FORUM ON LABOR MIGRATION - 2022”

“International Forum on labor migration - 2022”: In collaboration with the Ministry of Employment and Labor Relations of the Republic of Uzbekistan, the Agency for external labor migration, and Nordic International University, a new and broad event titled “Advantages of safe, orderly, and legal labor migration” took place on November 22-23. This event marked the first time official representatives from six countries participated, highlighting the importance of the topic.

Results:

- * During the discussion, several significant themes were addressed, including the protection of labor migrants' rights and interests, the analysis of global migration patterns and their underlying factors, the formulation of migration policies, and the examination of their influence on the social sphere;
- * A memorandum of mutual understanding was signed between NIU and the state unitary business “Agency for External Labor Migration.”
- * The Ministry of Employment and Labor Relations of the Republic of Uzbekistan expressed gratitude to the leadership of NIU through the letter of appreciation

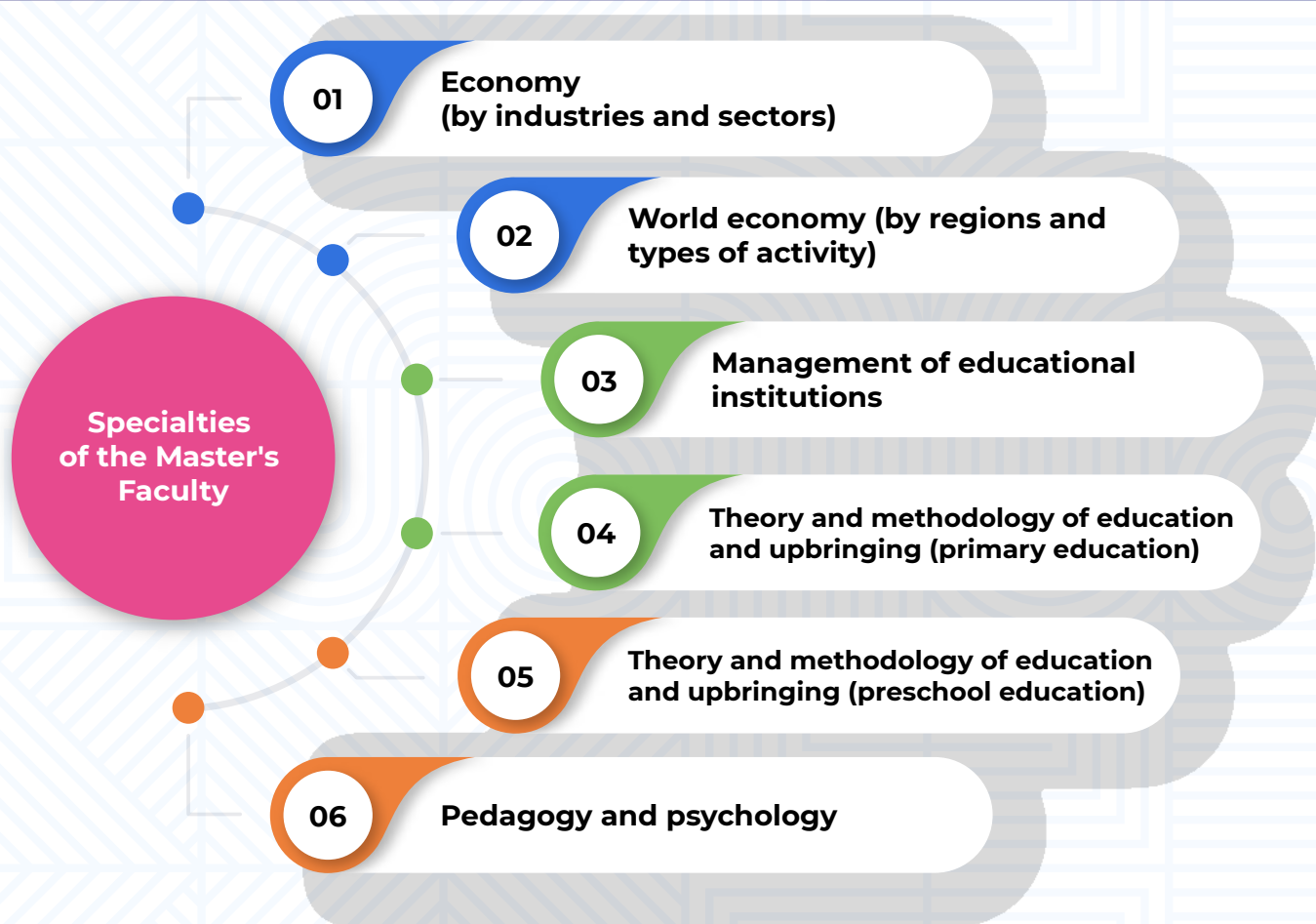
DEAN'S OFFICE DUTIES

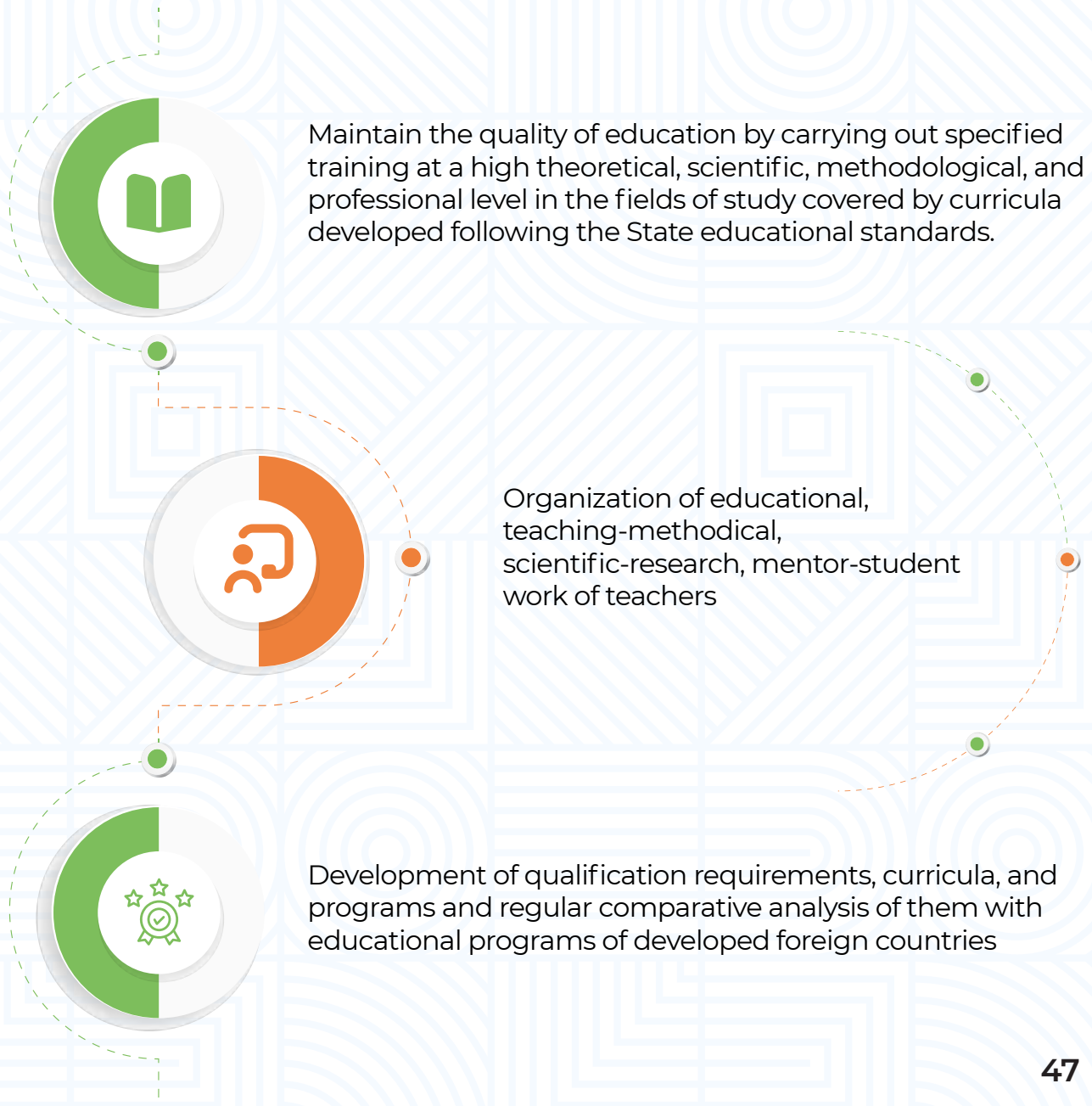
The professors and teachers of the department are actively involved in enhancing young individuals' spiritual and educational efforts.

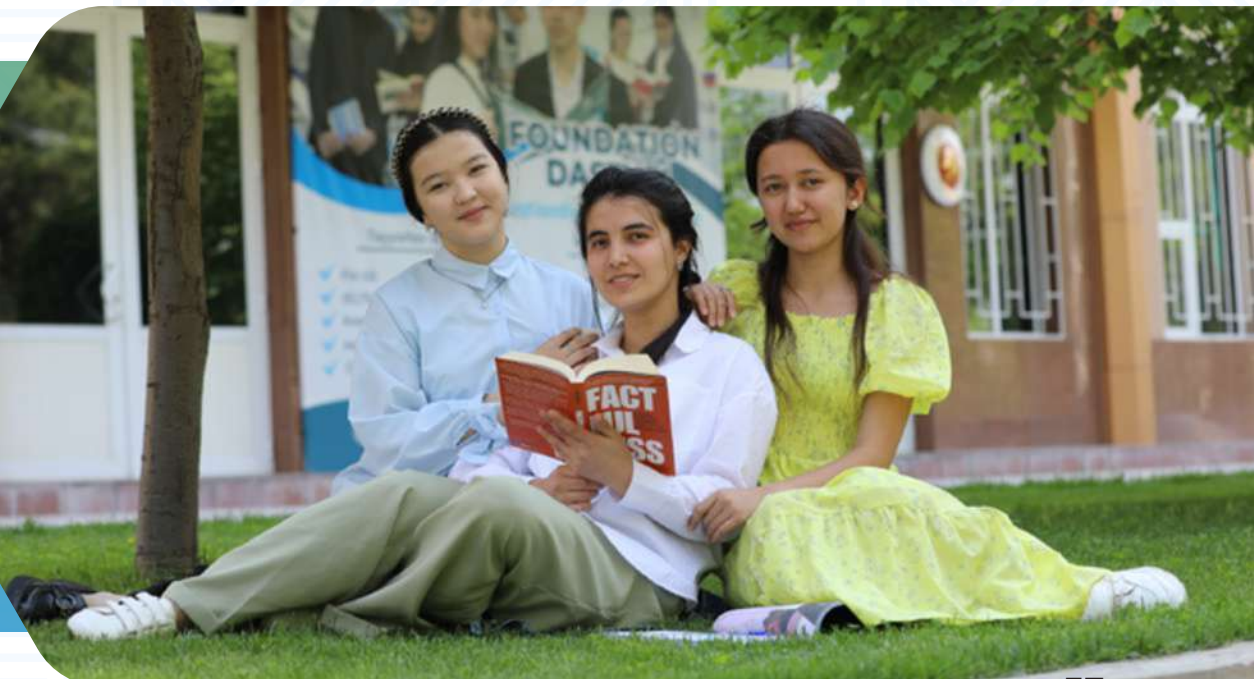


Who may enroll in the Foundation program?

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


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
